The Mayor's Moment ...

The 2008 Budget has been adopted by the Borough Council on June 28, 2008. The amount of the tax increase is 3 cents per \$100.00 assessed value. That means approximately a \$40.00 increase for a home assessed at \$133,000.00. The Mayor and Council had to use an additional \$125,000.00 in surplus to make up for the decrease in State aid from the Governor of New Jersey. South Bound Brook lost approximately \$129,230.00 in State aid and had an increase of approximately \$98,000.00 in pension costs. If the Borough didn't lose the state aid this year the borough would have had a flat tax increase or even considered a decrease in the tax rate. The Borough was able to use \$897,000.00 from the PILOT Program (payment in lieu of taxes) from the Canal Crossing development.

The Redevelopment Committee is continuing to bring more development into SBB including finding a buyer for the GAF Research Building located on Canal Road and the development of the old gas station located on Main St. across from the Ukrainian Church. The Planning Board recently approved the development of the property located on Johnson Street and Main Street. The plan includes the building of 22 owner occupied townhouses on this property which is a reduction from the original plan of 34 rental apartments. The Committee is working with the owners of Washington Park on Elizabeth Street to move this project forward.

The Mayor and Council are researching all possible new shared services with surrounding communities. The State has offered many grants for shared services and South Bound Brook will take whatever steps to save tax dollars by using these programs. The Borough already uses many shared services that save thousands of dollars for the taxpayers of SBB. We will continue to keep spending to a minimum while searching for new ways to bring more dollars into the Borough.

Mosquito Information -

Tips to reduce chances of getting bitten:

- Stay indoors a dawn, dusk and early evening.
- Wear long sleeve shirts and long pants.
- Avoid perfumes, lotions and colognes with heavy fragrances.
- Apply insect repellent containing 20% - 30% DEET to exposed skin or clothing (10% for children). Do not apply to children under 3 years of age. Read and follow directions carefully.

Reduce the Breeding areas for mosquitoes

by Removing old cans, buckets, flower pots and other containers especially old tires - these can produce thousands of mosquitoes. Clean out leaves from clogged roof gutters and drains.
